
# Calling all Lifeguards

### WE'RE HIRING: HBCA Beach Summer Gate Attendants

This is a part-time position, open to all ages!

We need reliable people with good attitudes to monitor cars and maintain a constant presence at the entrance of our private beach.

Main responsibilities include:

- Giving members beach permit stickers for their cars, kayaks and boats
- Placing beach permit stickers on car windows
- Ensuring all member cars have a sticker to enter the HBCA parking lot
- Making / keeping a list of member guests coming into the beach
- Telling guests where to park during special events
- Making sure drivers stop when they enter the beach and drive slowly when entering the lot

Other responsibilities may include moving traffic cones to ensure the safety of our beach, watering some plants, and other light duties, as assigned.

The beach is open from 9am to 9:30pm, seven days per week, during the summer.

We need people to fill two shifts: 9am to 3pm and 3pm to 9:30pm.

The season starts with weekend shifts in May, transitioning to 7 days a week from Memorial Day until Labor Day.


