Roles & Responsibilities to Consider

Interested in getting involved, but unsure of where you best fit? Read more details:

President: Ensures that everything runs smoothly and according to the by-laws. Supports the directors to carry out their respective functions. Drives all initiatives, ensures annual events are scheduling & planned, & oversees maintenance, construction, & safety on HBCA grounds and district boundaries. Hosts monthly board meetings & leads discussion on topics.

1st / 2nd Vice President: Supports the President & directors to keep the beach clean, safe & fun! Helps promote fundraising campaigns.

Treasurer: Financial forecasting and budgeting. Works with each executive board member to forecast annual expenses. Provides monthly board meeting reports to highlight year-to-date status of all expenses. Generates payments to vendors or contractors on behalf of the board.

Recording Secretary: Keeper of all documentation, votes, approvals, & actions taken at monthly board meetings. Takes meeting minutes; circulates & requests approvals of prior minutes from the board.

Roles & Responsibilities to Consider... Cont.

Security: Promotes general public safety on HBCA grounds and safeguards all HBCA assets. Knowledgable about public safety protocols & implements preventative measures to maintain year-round security. Works with key board members during the busy season to secure front gate entry. Most likely first responder to any issues on HBCA grounds; coordinates a plan of action, if not immediately available.

Building & Grounds: Gatekeeper to the beach (literally!). Promotes general improvements & safety of the HBCA beach grounds & casino. Has a keen eye for areas in need of TLC. Skilled in handling repairs, coordinating construction, hiring local contractors & facilitating capital improvement projects with the board. Available to manage the front entry gate at the beginning & close of the day. Coordinates a team to launch & winterize the swim float.

Summer Rec: Plans & organizes all daytime activities for the HBCA summer camp. Hires onsite vendors, CITs, counselors, & adult volunteers to assist with the program. Secures equipment, apparel, & materials necessary to carry out activities. Works with the Treasurer to manage registration, payroll, & budgets.

Water Safety: Leads & promotes water safety & medical preparedness at the beach & during Summer Rec. Coordinates hiring summer lifeguards & ensures proper training in water safety, CPR & medical equipment. Keeps a schedule of daily tasks for the lifeguards, including raking the sea grass & keeping restrooms & common areas tidy.

Boating: Monitors the docs & waterways. The central contact for boating operations, memberships, & commercial boating members. Ensures the dock, pier, boat ramp & dinghies are in tip-top shape, year round. Oversees any needed repairs & improvements.

Financial Secretary: Monitors HBCA memberships & generated annual income. Works with other key board members to ensure that event participants are members in good standing. Reports membership & income at monthly board meetings.

District Director: 1 per each of HBCA's 11 districts. Neighborhood representatives who report on any news & points of interest affecting their districts during monthly board meetings. Can offer assistance & contribute ideas to HBCA events throughout the year. Have voting rights on any subject matters brought to the board's attention. Assistant District Directors can be appointed for additional support, and will attend monthly board meetings when the District Director is unavailable. A great way to get involved, learn about the community, and work with a fun group of talented leaders!
